David Gordon Brown, II is a lifelong resident of Long Branch, NJ and graduated from Long Branch High School in 1988. He's a Kean University graduate with a Bachelor of Arts (1997) degree and Masters of Arts (2000) degree in Public Administration. While studying at Kean University, David served as the President of the student body and its representative to the Board of Trustees. In addition, David revived and restored the Young Democrats College Chapter at Kean and served as its President as well. During David's tenure with the Young Dems he assisted the local County and Municipal Democrats in organizing a rally for then President Bill Clinton in Union Township (1996).

In the late 1990's David worked as a Legislative Assistant to Senator Wynona Lipman. David managed Sen. Lipman's campaigns and he also spent time as political operative for the Elizabeth Democratic Organization serving in the role of GOTV assistant. Then in 2001 David served on the advance team for Mayor Jim McGreevey, who was running for Governor.

After working for Jim McGreevey, David went on to work for then Councilman Cory Booker as his Executive Director/Deputy Treasurer for his 2002 campaign for Mayor. As Booker was not successful in that campaign, David stayed on through the years as an ELEC adviser and worked on several other campaigns in Hudson, Essex and Union Counties at the Legislative and local levels as Treasurer.

In 2005, David became the first African American Borough Administrator for the Borough of Roselle (Union County). He then was called back in 2007 by Mayor Booker's Administration to serve as the lead project manager for the Newark Arena (Prudential Center). He later served in the capacity of Director of the Urban Enterprise Zone. Upon completion of the Arena, David served in 2010 as the Director of Public Works & Urban Development for the City of Plainfield.

In 2011, David became the Borough Administrator for the Borough of Roselle where he currently serves in that role. In 2016, David was appointed by the Governor of New Jersey to the Monmouth County Board of Taxation as a Commissioner to a five-year term.

David is married to Tasha Youngblood Brown, the Director of Internal Audit at Princeton University and together they have three children, Tamyca, attends the University of Maryland, Aaliyah and Mya, who both attend Long Branch Public schools.
